

Antibiotic Use

Antibiotics are given strategically on our farm, administered on a case-by-case basis per pig. Only when a pig is sick, susceptible, or has been exposed to an illness, is it given antibiotic treatment. This means that there is not a general use of routine antibiotics in feed. Contrary to what you may have read in the media about other pig farms, we can assure you that we do not use as much antibiotic medication today on 16,000 pigs, as we did on 2,400 head just 25 years ago. That is quite a statement, but it is a testament

to the fact that the normal hog operations in today's market farming practices have made great strides in reducing antibiotic use.

Let's answer how.

Having the pigs inside a controlled environment with strict bio security, we are able to keep cleaner, healthier living conditions for today's livestock. Sanitation is so much easier in today's production practices when every pig is kept inside and is not being exposed to bedding materials that may harbor parasites and insects.
